When taking a child to the bathroom *
Prop the outer door open and remain in the hallway until the child is finished Go in with the child and close all doors for the child's privacy Send them by themselves. They don't need any supervision.
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If you have reason to believe that abuse has occurred *
Notify the Pastor or ministry leader immediately and report to the Department of Children's Services (DCS)
Talk it over with your spouse or friend to see what they think Keep it to yourself, you'll only cause trouble
If you witness someone at church treating a child/youth inappropriately, you should *
Try and create a diversion so others won't notice
 Confront the person and tell them they should be ashamed of themselves Try and remove the child/youth from the situation and contact the ministry leader immediately
In a medical emergency, you should *
Panic and freak out
Wait to find the parent or a staff member for further instructions Call 911 if needed while you have your second adult keep other kids calm
If you are unable to fulfill your scheduled volunteer position, you should
Let the ministry leader know so they can find a replacement for you
Let the ministry leader know and then try to find another volunteer to switch or fill-in for you Don't show up, nobody will miss you
